Weekly Crime Blotter: 10.31.22 - 11.06.22

The weekly crime blotter provides a snapshot of crimes, arrests and other law enforcement activity in the City of Issaquah for the prior week. Data is sourced from official Calls for Service records of the Issaquah Police Department (IPD). The crime blotter compiles incidents deemed noteworthy by IPD and does not include all calls, incidents or self-initiated activities handled by officers. Date, Time	Location	Description	Offense
10/31/22, 0806	Highlands DR NE& NE High ST	At 0806 hrs, a vehicle ran a red light and hit another vehicle. Both parties were uninjured and both vehicles were able to be pushed off the roadway and towed.	Accident
10/31/22, 1844	11th Ave NE & 10th Ave NE	Around 1844 hrs, IPD received a call reporting 9-10 juveniles reportedly taking candy and scaring others. Officers checked the area and were unable to locate any juveniles.	Disturbance
10/31/22, 2313	Highlands DR NE & NE Discovery DR	On 10/31/22 around 2313 hrs, IPD received multiple calls regarding an accident on Highlands and Discovery. Two cars, driven by juveniles were racing southbound on 9th Ave approaching NE Discovery when the light turned red. One car was able to stop but the other ran the red light and collided with another vehicle. The injured juveniles were taken to the hospital. Washington State Patrol has taken over the investigation. 11/01/22, 0348	130 East Sunset Way	At 0348 hrs on 11/01/22, an individual arrived at the police station claiming they were stranded on the highway with no means to call an uber or taxi to go home, which was a few jurisdictions over. In response, officers gave the individual a ride to the transit center to safely take a bus home.	Citizen Assist
11/01/22, 1750	900 BLK NE Ingram Way	Around 1750 hrs, IPD received a report of potential fighting between juveniles with boxing gloves. Upon contact, it was found that the group of kids were play fighting and exercising. None of the involved juveniles were injured and subsequently made their way home.	Welfare Check
11/01/22, 2138	900 BLK NE Ingram Way	A call was received around 2138 hrs regarding a potential fight between local residents. After thorough investigation, one resident was arrested for physically harming the other and exposing minors to such violence.	Domestic Violence

11/02/22, 0825	NW Talus DR & Renton-Issaquah RD	There was a report in the early hours of a potential U-Haul involved in a series of catalytic converter thefts which was not located. During routine patrol, an officer came across a U-Haul and upon seeing the officer, the truck began to accelerate. After an attempted and failed stop, the officer pursued the speeding truck to the edge of city limits. Case was referred to the appropriate authorities.	Suspicious/ Traffic stop
11/02/22, 1047	100 BLK Rainier BLVD S	Around 1000 hrs, a resident reported hearing a bang on their door. When they responded, a nearby group of roughly 7 male juveniles confronted them and threw water bottles at the resident before departing in a direction towards the community center and middle school.	Disturbance
11/02/22, 1913	17th Ave NW & NW Gilman BLVD	Around 1913 hrs, officers attempted to stop a vehicle with an expired tag. Upon initiating patrol lights, the vehicle took off, swerving in and out of traffic before getting onto the I-90 West. The case was referred to WSP for follow-up.	Traffic Stop
11/03/22, 0050	200 BLK Mountain Park BLVD SW	On 11/03/22, a call was received reporting a possible party with loud music coming from an apartment. Upon arrival, officers observed no party or music. If there was a party, IPD was sadly not invited.	Noise Complaint
11/03/22, 0758	100 BLK Front ST S	A report was received around 0758 hrs of an adult in a dark blue sedan asking two juveniles if they wanted a ride to the high school. Neither of the kids knew the person nor recalled ever seeing them before. The suspicious individual is described as being an Asian female in her 20-30's with straight black hair, driving a dark blue sedan with a "Student Driver" sticker on the back left bumper. 11/03/22, 1131	6000 BLK East Lake Sammamish PKWY	On 11/03/22, IPD received a report of a stolen vehicle. The owner of the car was shopping while it occurred. The vehicle was left unlocked and the keys were under the seat at the time.	Vehicle Theft
11/03/22, 1652	400 BLK NW Gilman BLVD	Around 1652 hrs, IPD was contacted by an individual who found themselves stranded after coming to town for a doctor's appointment and couldn't get a hold of family to get a ride. 11/03/22, 1759	Newport Way NW & NW Dogwood ST	On 11/03/22, around 1800 hrs, during a traffic stop, a silver sedan with stolen plates took off into oncoming traffic. Within minutes, a call was received involving the same vehicle hitting two other vehicles and fleeing. Due to the amount of traffic on the roadway, officers could not safely pursue the vehicle without putting residents at risk and stopped pursuit to instead return to look for vehicles that were reportedly hit. 11/04/22, 0420	800 BLK Front ST N	Between the hours of 0420 and 0430, two white males forced entry into an on site storage unit and stole various tools and an American flag before escaping in a tan and black late 1990's Ford F-150 truck.	Burglary
11/04/22, 1302	Rainier Trail	On 11/04/22, IPD received a call from a self - injured individual who stated they were lost in the woods with their phone at 1%. Local security were able to locate the individual and escort them to a trailhead to be seen by EMS and get further treatment.	Welfare Check

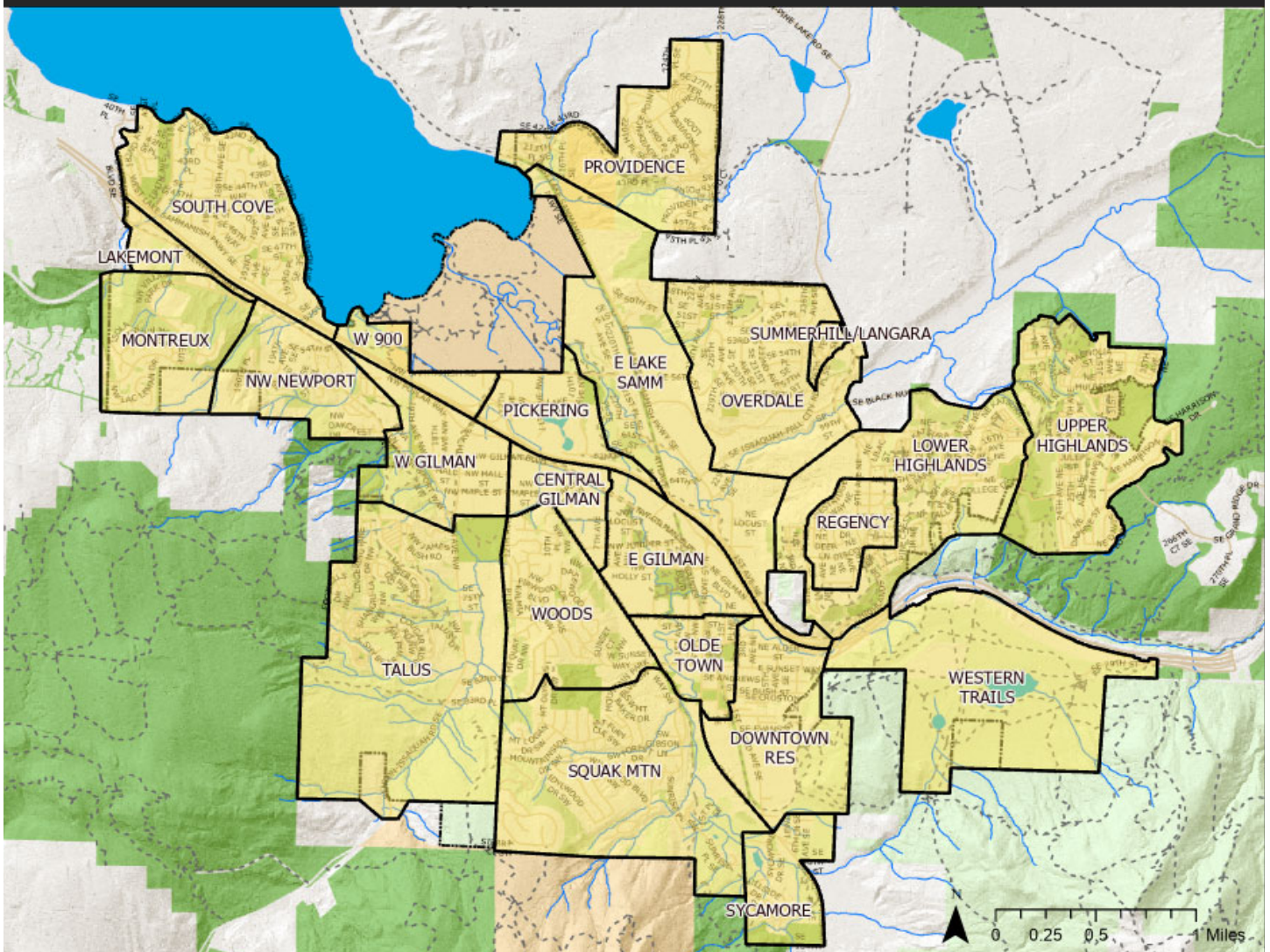


Date, Time	Location	Description	Offense
11/05/22, 1600	1700 BLK 10th Ave NW	Around 1600 hrs on 11/05/22, officers were dispatched to a report of an assault in progress. A female attempted to shoplift homemade goods from an event and became physical with an employee when they tried to stop her. At the employee's insistence, no charges were pressed, but a warning about conduct was given to the attempted shoplifter.	Assault
11/05/22, 1845	900 BLK NE High ST	On 11/05/22, a couple were parking their vehicle when a large group of teens reportedly began shooting gel pellets at the vehicle. The group were then reported proceeding to set off fireworks near the YWCA. Officers responded were unable to positively identify teens involved in the mischief.	Malicious Mischief
11/06/22, 0010	100 BLK Front ST N	Just after midnight, IPD got a call regarding a male who had been drinking, pacing around the building and then getting into their car. Officers were able to respond prior to the individual leaving. The individual agreed to take an UBER home and no ticket was necessary.	DUI
11/06/22, 2122	4000 BLK 213th PL SE	Around 2122 hrs, IPD responded to a burglary in progress. The victim was reportedly awoken to find a man looking though the luggage laying on the floor of their bedroom. They promptly ran for the door and downstairs. One of the burglars attempted to stop the victim prior to yelling "run" and making a getaway. One of the burglars is described as a tall male with olive skin, blue shirt, and dark pants, while the other individual is presently unknown.
