Weekly Crime Blotter: 11.14.22 - 11.20.22

The weekly crime blotter provides a snapshot of crimes, arrests and other law enforcement activity in the City of Issaquah for the prior week. Data is sourced from official Calls for Service records of the Issaquah Police Department (IPD). The crime blotter compiles incidents deemed noteworthy by IPD and does not include all calls, incidents or self-initiated activities handled by officers. Date, Time	Location	Description	Offense
11/14/22, 1058	SE Black Nugget RD & East Lake Sammamish PKWY SE	On 11/14/22, around 1058 hrs, a two vehicle collision occurred on SE Black Nugget RD at the private driveway entrance to a local business. There was significant damage to the front of both vehicles, resulting air bag deployment for both vehicles. Fortunately, both drivers were wearing their seatbelts and reported no injuries.	Accident
11/14/22, 1614	2000 BLK Tiger View CT NW	Around 1614 hrs, we received a follow up call regarding a series of incidents occurring around the 2000 block of Tiger View Court. On 11/11/22, an individual reported their brakes failing sometime in the evening. It was later confirmed their brakes were intentionally tampered with. This individual reported various neighbors experiencing similar acts of malicious mischief, from punctured gas tanks to tampered brakes. Officers advised sharing with neighbors to report circumstances to IPD to assist investigation into these acts.	Malicious Mischief

11/14/22, 2026	1000 BLK 10th Way NE	On 11/14/22, multiple calls were received regarding separate occurrences of theft from a local business. In the first instance, the local loss prevention were able to thwart a trio of thieves attempting to take over \$700.00 worth of clothing. In the second instance, an individual attempting to take a shopping cart of items ditched their cart upon seeing officers on site. All goods were recovered in both occurrences.	Theft In-Progress
11/15/22, 0853	1000 BLK Westridge Way NE	At approximately 0900 hrs, IPD received a concerned call regarding a transient camp on local parklands behind Westridge Way NE. Due to the location, Park Rangers were notified and dispatched to clear the encampment.	Unwanted Subject
11/15/22, 1141	NE Natalie Way	On 11/15/22, IPD received a call regarding a white female walking two shepherds, reportedly in distress. Upon arrival, it was discovered the residents on scene wanted the woman to cease allowing her dogs playing in an area typically closed off during winter. The female was gone upon arrival but officers contacted the Park Ranger to see if signage could be posted on the restricted area of the park for all to be aware.	Welfare Check
11/15/22, 1518	1000 BLK 10th Way NE	Around 1518 hrs, two black females in their 30's-40's were reported attempting to run out of a local business via the emergency exit, with stolen items. The business did not want to prosecute, so the case was closed and the females were free to go.	Theft In-Progress
11/15/22, 1546	1000 BLK NW Gilman BLVD	Around 1546 hrs, a man reported his white 2007 Ford Econoline going missing around 0830 hrs earlier that morning. A stolen vehicle form was created and dispatch entered the vehicle as stolen.	Vehicle Theft

11/16/22, 0124	200 BLK NE Juniper ST	On 11/16/22, multiple calls were received at varying times regarding an alarm going off at the location. Officers arrived on location to find a security guard there who noted they were having issues with the alarm system. Officers performed a perimeter check of the property and found nothing suspicious.	Suspicious
11/16/22, 1100	130 East Sunset Way	Around 1100 hrs, IPD received a call from a concerned citizen in Ohio regarding a package that has not been shipped yet from a local business and concerns that the business is not legitimate. Officers contacted the company, reached customer service and they identified that they will call the customer promptly to resolve.	Citizen Assist
11/16/22, 1201	3rd Ave NE & NE Birch ST	On 11/16/22, a concerned citizen reported what appeared to be 3 juveniles in a white vehicle potentially doing drugs during school hours. Officers arrived and confiscated a variety of drugs and drug paraphernalia. All 3 juveniles were given a very stern warning and each of their parents were called to come pick up the children. The first subject assaulted the second with a belt and then proceeded to share with others that they had a bag of bullets that they would use. Officers were able to recover the bullets and discussed the matter with all parents involved.	Assault/ Juvenile-Related
11/17/22, 0049	100 BLK Rainier BLVD N	Around 0049 hrs, a concerned resident reported a loud party, possibly releasing fireworks as well. Officers responded and requested the subject turn the music down and they complied. IPD was, sadly, not invited to the party.	Noise Complaint

11/17/22, 0707	Across Issaquah: Oldtown, Squak, and Woods Neighborhoods	On 11/17/22, IPD received multiple calls reporting loud explosions or fireworks from somewhere in the respective neighborhoods occurring the previous night and in the morning. Officers were unable to locate any individuals involved with setting off fireworks.	Fireworks/ Noise Complaint
11/17/22, 1311	Highlands DR NE & I-90 FWY	Around 1311 hrs on 11/17/22, concerned citizens reported seeing a young male, possibly in his 20's, looking over the overpass. An officer responded to find the individual wanted to get to out of town but had no transportation. After further discussion, the subject agreed to see city behavioral health specialists.	Suspicious/ Welfare Check
11/17/22, 1646	130 East Sunset Way	On 11/17/22, a caller reported a resident owing them money on a house remodel. When they brought this up, the resident reportedly located and contacted various family members of the individual at their homes with threats. Officers advised that the contacted family members report the incident to their local police.	Citizen Assist
11/18/22, 1301	700 BLK NE Blakely DR	At approximately 1301 hrs on 11/18/22, officers received a call from a local health care center that an individual who was involuntarily committed had just walked out of the emergency room. Once officers found the individual, the suspect attempted to hit one and ran to the police car, attempting to open the driver's side door. Officers were able to subdue the individual and return them to receive care.	Suspicious
11/18/22, 1339	1000 BLK 7th Ave NW	IPD received a call reporting a 45 year old white male, possibly homeless, was lingering on the property. When they were asked to leave the premises, they became agitated and then pulled out a knife. Security was able to take the knife and dispose of it. 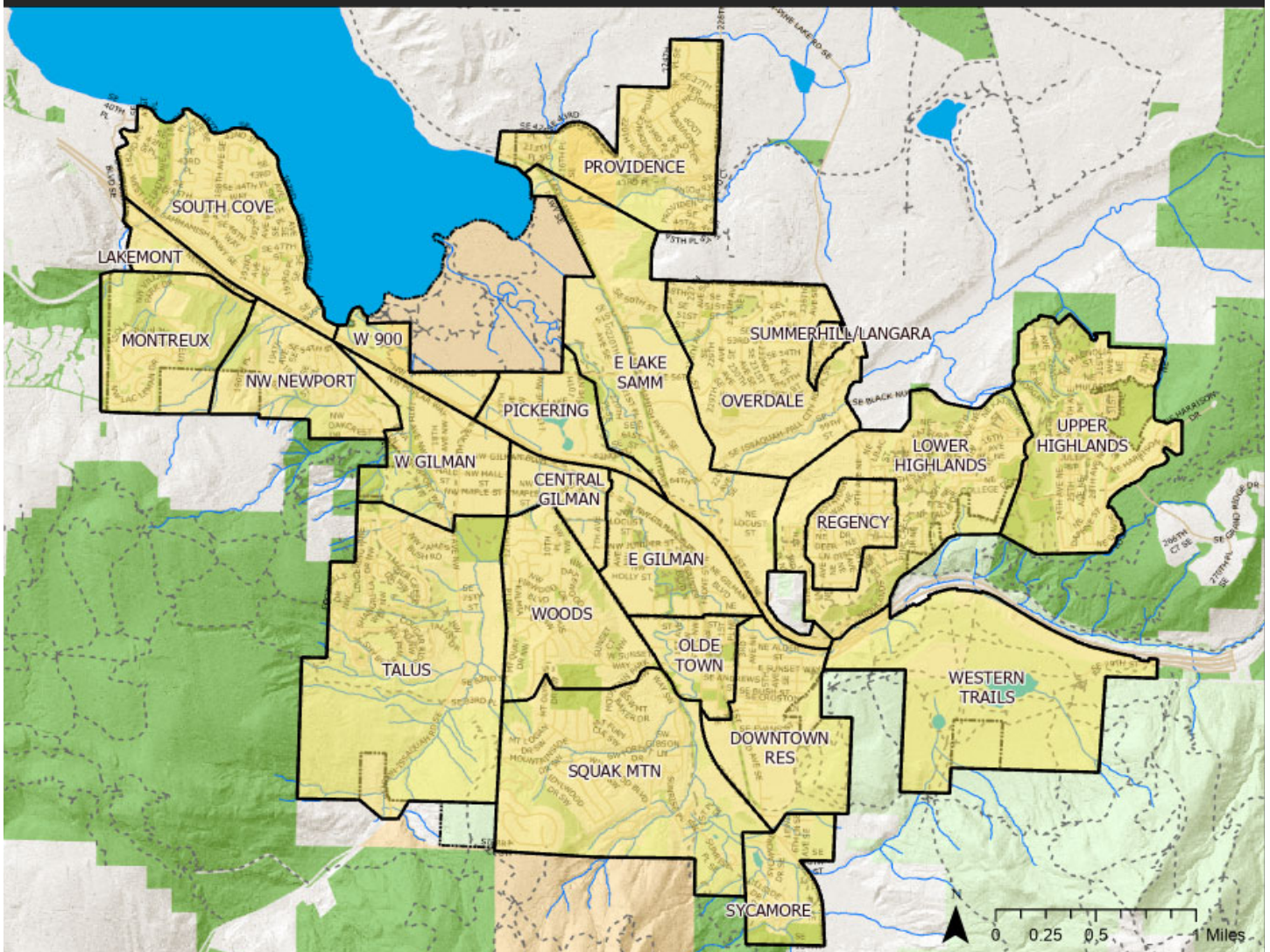


Date, Time	Location	Description	Offense
11/18/22, 2151	4000 BLK 185th PL SE	On 11/18/22, a call was received regarding a knock on their door and a note being left stating a corpse had been left on their rooftop. Responding officers found the note to look like it was written by a child. A perimeter check and investigation was done and nothing suspicious was found.	Suspicious
11/19/22, 1001	1000 BLK 7th Ave NW	Multiple calls were received regarding a white male subject refusing to leave the premises in the evening. On this occasion, the male yelled threats to kill themselves or others. Officers responded and the male agreed to leave.	Welfare Check
11/19/22, 1248	900 BLK NE High ST	On 11/19/22, IPD received a call for an ongoing complaint from residents regarding a group of juveniles running around the parking garage shooting each other with either airsoft or pellet guns. There is concern that the ammunition may potentially harm the juveniles or damage vehicles. The juveniles were gone upon police arrival.	Juvenile-Related
