Weekly Crime Blotter: 11.21.22 - 11.27.22

The weekly crime blotter provides a snapshot of crimes, arrests and other law enforcement activity in the City of Issaquah for the prior week. Data is sourced from official Calls for Service records of the Issaquah Police Department (IPD). The crime blotter compiles incidents deemed noteworthy by IPD and does not include all calls, incidents or self-initiated activities handled by officers. 11/21/22, 1149	East Sunset Way & Front ST North	On 11/21/22, two juveniles were seen riding in the back of a small red pick up truck without seatbelts while reportedly getting lunch during their break. The driver was educated on the safety laws and given a verbal warning while the two juveniles walked back to school.	Area Check

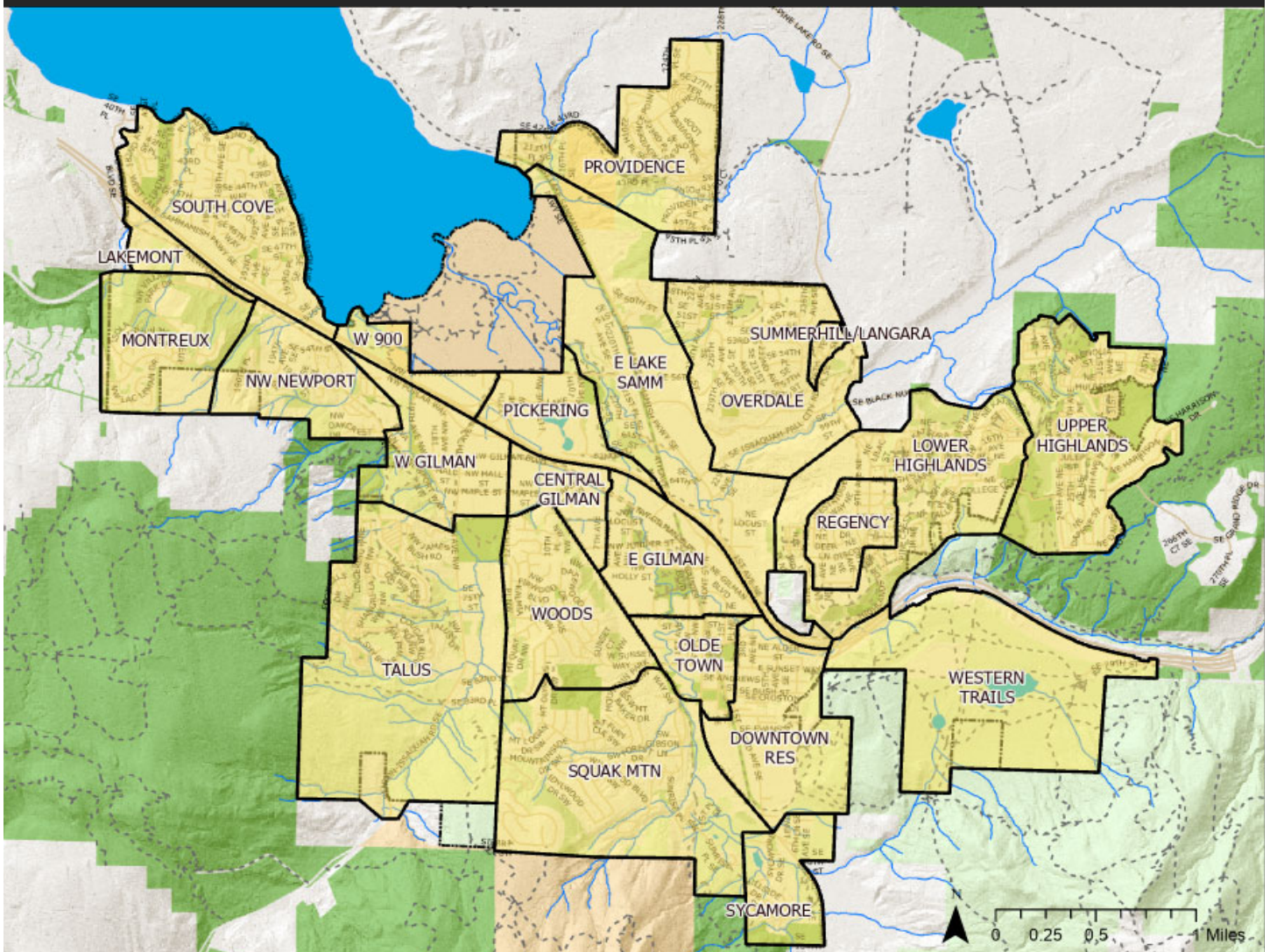


Date, Time	Location	Description	Offense
11/26/22, 2003	1100 BLK NW Gilman BLVD	On 11/26/22, around 2003 hrs, a local employee called reporting that an intoxicated male entered their business looking for their bag of stolen items from REI and Petco. Officers arrived to find the man gone upon arrival.	Suspicious
11/26/22, 2141	12th Ave NW and NW Gilman BLVD	Around 2141 hrs, a white sedan was witnessed turning the opposite direction of the turn lane they were in, without a turn signal, cutting off two lanes of traffic. Officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but the car continued on to run a red light and increase speed. Due to the location and amount of vehicles on the road, it was deemed unsafe to continue pursuit and the traffic stop was canceled.	Traffic Stop
