

Q1 What time did you park/What time was this survey taken?






Q3 How did you get to the Park & Ride this morning?


Q4 Where did you park?




Q1 How did you get to the transit stop this morning?


Q2 Where did you park?




Q1 What time did you arrive at work this morning?

Q2 How did you get to work this morning?



Q3 Where did you park?







Q1 How did you get to the Senior Center today?









Over the past 10 yrs, the make up of DT Issaquah has changed a lot, but there has been no increased parking capacity.

You mentioned the cost per parking spot to build, but you neglected the lost tax revenue for each consumer who cannot find a parking spot, and who goes elsewhere.

Economic growth requires increased consumers. In brick and mortar retail, increasing consumers requires increased parking capacity.

Again, there has been no increase on parking capacity in 10+ years, yet Issaquah continues to approve new residential buildings, increasing the population by thousands. On any given day, that is hundreds of potential consumers.

The make up of DT Isaquah has swung to evening visitors, with additional bars and restaurants. These business would benefit from increased parking... and that success directly adds more revenue to issaguah.

Not sure of the expertise of the consultants you hired, but in my professional opinion, they are severely wrong. Limiting parking up until 8pm will hurt the bars and restaurants.

Thank you for the heads up about the parking meeting today at the Issaquah Shell. Unfortunately I am unable to make it. Good luck getting feedback from the community.

I for one think we have a small parking problem. No where near the traffic congestion problems. Indeed, during my 7+ years in Issaquah I have never been unable to find a parking spot. Yes, on theatre nights and other big events it is challenging at times, but never such that a block or two walk can't solve the problem. Limiting certain Front St. or parking lot spots to several hours may well be a good step. (Thinking about the tan camper and others that have sort of moved in.) Putting in meters or encouraging for fee parking will make us like Seattle or what is quickly becoming Bellevue. Perhaps there are alternatives with some of the lessor used properties. Either for purchase by the city to provide another low rise, low/no cost parking structure like that by the library? Or merchant improvements / payments to fund structure. Letting Diamond Parking or others come in an turn our beautiful city in to paid parking is a very unpleasant — and I would suggest unpopular approach.

Any rate, a little feedback from someone who loves Issaquah and thinks the suggestion of a real parking problem is overrated. Making our city walkable and bike friendly is significantly more enlightened and helpful long term.

Not sure I can make the meeting tonight.

Parking downtown is getting harder. I'm very familiar with the back streets and hidden secrets...and...they aren't so secret anymore, folks are discovering them. I can usually find something but it takes more time driving around. Consequently, I have to allow more time to get to meetings, etc. Meanwhile the population and demand continues to grow.

- During the day, there are countless assorted employees that take street parking spaces for the entire day. Others park for an even longer time, using downtown street parking as a 'Park and Ride' and they catch a bus to other employer locations, e.g. Bellevue and Seattle.
- In the evenings, the theater patrons' vehicles are in spaces for many hours, most restaurants/bar customers are parked for one or two.

Has your research found that it is better to apply time limits?

Is it possible to acquire property and build a parking structure? Having theater parking near their facility. The King County Library parking structure is a great example, perhaps with one more floor. Somewhere near downtown like the Eagles parking lot, or where the old little house is behind the theater, or not as convenient – the Elks site.

My perspective on parking for the downtown area is that we need a significant parking structure. Policing our own lot off of First Place is impossible. There is so much pressure from newer restaurants and Village Theater that people are constantly using our lot, which is desperately needed for our own clients.

Please do not go to time limit parking along Front. We have about 20 people who work in our building off and on each day, but only 14 spaces in our own lot. The way we attempt to save parking for our clients is to park as staff and faculty along Front Street and along the Railroad tracks.

People already struggle with Front Street traffic to get to downtown businesses, and it's a growing deterrent to people coming to us instead of other locales and shopping areas. Let's reward people who come downtown with an all around better parking option. Ideally a multi level structure that really accommodates.
