1 EMILY DARST PARK

Look upstream from the Emily Darst Park Bridge and walk to 4th Ave NW.

How would you like to cross I-90?

Through the existing underpass at 4th Ave, under the bridge along Issaquah Creek, or other ways?

2 SENA PARK

Stand on the bridge crossing Issaquah Creek.

Looking downstream, where and how would you want to cross Gilman Blvd?

Looking upstream, how would you want to get to Salmon Run Nature Park?

Along 5th Ave NW, along the Creek, other ways?

3 BERNTSEN + CONFLUENCE PARKS

Visit each park.


How would you like to get from Salmon Run Nature Park to Bernsten Park to Confluence Park? A new trail along the creek?

Where would you cross the creek? Using existing streets and bridges, a new pedestrian bridge at NW Holly St?

4 DEPOT PARK AND VETERANS' MEMORIAL FIELD

Stand at Depot Park and look to the west down Alder Street toward Issaquah Creek.

Should a trail connect Issaquah Creek to these parks? How else can these parks connect with the Issaquah Creek trail system?



5 FRONT STREET PARK

Walk from Veterans' Memorial Field to Front Street Park and down to Issaquah Creek.

What would you like to do in the future at Front Street Park?

How can the connection between Issaquah Creek and Veterans' Memorial Field be made more clear?

6 SQUAK MOUNTAIN ACCESS TRAIL

Walk down the Squak Mountain Access Trail and think about the whole Issaquah Creek trail system.

What should the character, materials, and size of the trail be?

Should the trail character be consistent throughout the Issaquah Creek corridor or should it respond to the individual parks and nearby urban or natural areas?

7 SQUAK VALLEY PARK

Think about walking, running, or biking from Lake Sammamish State Park to Squak Valley Park.

How would you like to get from Olde Town to Squak Valley Park? Along Front Street, through the neighborhoods, along the Creek?

8 SQUAK VALLEY PARK

Look to Squak Mountain to the west and Tiger Mountain to the east.

Do you want to connect to these natural areas from Squak Valley Park?

Should Squak Valley park serve as a new trailhead to these mountains?
