Description of proposal: – The following update to the Street Standards are being proposed by the City of Issaquah.

Update to the Street Standards (Public Works Street Standards) to update references to the overhauled Title 18 Land Use Code, reflect the City’s current organizational chart, remove gender specific references, incorporate the City’s Bicycle Level of Traffic Street from the Mobility Master Plan and Comprehensive Plan, change from loop detectors to radar detectors at traffic signals, incorporate the Central Issaquah Circulation Standards and Skybridge requirements from the former Title 18, and adds Street Typologies to a select number of streets.

Location of proposal: City of Issaquah city limits.

Appeal process:

This DNS is issued under WAC 197-11-340(2). There is a 14-day comment period between June 20, 2023, to July 4, 2023, followed by a 14-day appeal period. Anyone wishing to comment may submit written comments to the Responsible Official. The Responsible Official will consider the determination based on timely comments. Any person aggrieved by this determination may appeal by filing a Notice of Appeal no later than 4:00 p.m. on July 18, 2023, and paying a filing fee. Appeals may be filed electronically by emailing the same to CPDSupportServices@issaquahwa.gov. A hard copy of the Notice of Appeal and a check for the filing fee must be deposited in the mail addressed to City of Issaquah Permit Center, Attention Candy Baer, PO Box 1307, Issaquah, WA 98027 and post-marked no later than July 18, 2023, for the appeal to be valid. Appeals of this SEPA determination must be consolidated with the hearing of the underlying decision, per IMC 18.800.
